Fall Cleanup Week

ORGANIC PICK-UP - ALL ITEMS MUST BE AT THE CURBSIDE Monday, November 14th BY 7:00 a.m. Regardless of your scheduled pick-up day.

This clean-up will be for the collection of leaves and yard waste for composting. Leaves, grass clippings, and bundled twigs that are no longer than 4ft. in length and less than 50lbs. should be placed curbside. Residents are required to use clear compostable bags, non-waxed cardboard cartons or garbage cans that can be emptied into the trucks. No trees larger than 4 inches in diameter. **Construction material, such as plywood, will not be picked up.**

Residents are encouraged to compost these materials on their own property for use in landscaping and gardening but if this is not appropriate or desirable, the annual pickup provides an environmentally sound means of disposal.

PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR COMPOST CART FOR THIS PICK-UP.

A Message from Mayor Nancy Grant

Rothesay has enjoyed another beautiful summer, with many residents out and enjoying our events and our facilities, both on land and on water. Both Renforth Wharf Day and the Dragon Boat Festival were great successes, even if the dragonboats couldn't actually race. But the Mayors' Challenge is on for next year!

The renewed Common has been particularly busy, with a large number of people at the Canada Day celebration, and, even on ordinary days, many residents putting the space to varied and individual uses. We have had good use of the playeround and basketball courts, yoga on the Common, as well a



use of the playground and basketball courts, yoga on the Common, as well as an Oasis coffee house, and a Walk n'Talk, and, of course, our Playground Program. As an example of the usage of the Common, the August 25th Concert in the Common saw a good number of people enjoying the Jared Lutes concert, but others playing basketball, using the playground, enjoying a soccer game over by the school, kite- flying, dog-walking, and generally socializing. The Common has become everything a common public space should be, and as an added bonus, it is wonderful to see people of all ages being active.

Capital Projects:

The Almon and Peters Lanes project is now complete, and looks wonderful.

The major Utilities project on the Rothesay Road continues - this is Phase I of our Wastewater Treatment Upgrade, which will eventually see all of Rothesay's wastewater transmitted to a new treatment plant at Sagamore Point. We recognize that this project has been an inconvenience for residents, and we thank them for their patience. The project is on schedule, and will be complete by early November.

The new facilities in Wells Recreation Park: construction is complete on the new ballfield and dogpark. The only remaining issue is growth of the grass, which has taken longer than expected because of the dry summer. And the beautiful new Wells trail is proving very popular.

Autumn is a beautiful time in Rothesay - a wonderful time to enjoy our magnificent scenery, and perhaps participate in some of the walks/ runs scheduled to take place in support of a variety of good causes. As I discovered during the spring election campaign, all the neighbourhoods of Rothesay are beautiful, and each has its own individual charm. What better time to get out and explore a neighbourhood that might not be familiar to you than in the cool, crisp air of fall.

A note from the Emergency Measures Committee: residents are encouraged to sign up for Sentinel Emergency Alert. This can be done on the Town website, or in person at Town Hall. And a reminder: in case of extended power outage, the McGuire Centre will be open for warmth, charging devices and water.

I hope all our residents enjoy this fall; and with the students back, please remember to observe speed zones around our schools.
