## A Message From Mayor Nancy Grant

It has been another busy, active summer in Rothesay, with both K Park and Renforth beaches, as well as the Common all seeing excellent usage. In addition, the new Wells ball field, now the home field of the KV Girls Softball Association, and the new dog park have proved very popular. Residents continue to take great pleasure in the Wells trail which accommodates walkers, joggers, cyclists, wheelchairs and strollers. The trail will continue to see activity into the fall and winter by providing recreation for skiers and snowshoers. The summer also saw another successful season of playground programs and a very successful YMCA-run day camp at the Bill McGuire Memorial Centre. It is indeed heartwarming for your Mayor and Council to see so many residents out being active and enjoying the Town's recreational facilities - so many benefits to our physical and mental health come with activity!



In terms of Operations, the Town completed Phase I of our Wastewater Treatment upgrade project that started last summer with the installation of the new force main on Rothesay Road. The new lift stations at Kennebecasis Park and Renforth have been completed; and the East Riverside-Kingshurst Park station is nearing completion - the latter will also house public washrooms which will be much appreciated by walkers and cyclists. The restoration work behind the curbs has been completed. We thank residents for their patience as major reconstruction projects were completed on Oakville Lane, Second Street, and the Watermain Project was completed on Hampton Road.

There is considerable development happening in the Town - the condominium project on Hillcrest Drive being the largest piece and an apartment complex on Hampton Road. I have heard from many seniors who are pleased with our efforts to diversify our housing stock and to densify our downtown. These changes are needed as our older residents choose to downsize and wish to remain in our community.

Rothesay Council has begun its work on our age-friendly initiative, one of the priorities approved by Council in December. Rothesay has been recognized by the Honourable Lisa Harris, Minister of Seniors and Long-Term Care for its efforts toward becoming an "Age-Friendly Community". One of the next steps in our efforts will be to conduct an "Age-Friendly" survey of the community in the near future. A big thank you to residents who have volunteered to help with this project by sharing their ideas on making Rothesay more age friendly. If you would like to get involved please connect with us by calling Town Hall at 848-6600.

A final note from the Emergency Measures Committee - residents are encouraged to sign up online or at Town Hall for the Sentinel Emergency Alert System; and a reminder that in case of power outages lasting more than 24 hours, the Bill McGuire Memorial Centre will be open for warmth, water and charging of devices.



### ORGANIC PICK-UP - ALL ITEMS MUST BE AT THE CURBSIDE Monday, November 13 BY 7:00 a.m. Regardless of your scheduled pick-up day


This clean-up will be for the collection of leaves and yard waste for composting. Leaves, grass clippings, and bundled twigs that are no longer than 4ft. in length and less than 50lbs. should be placed curbside. Residents are to use clear compostable bags, non-waxed cardboard cartons or garbage cans that can be emptied into the trucks. No trees larger than 4 inches in diameter. **Construction material, such as plywood, will not be picked up.** 

Residents are encouraged to compost these materials on their own property for use in landscaping and gardening but if this is not appropriate or desirable, the annual pickup provides an environmentally sound means of disposal.

### PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR COMPOST CART FOR THIS PICK-UP


