Rothesay Curbside Recycling

Collect your recyclables into two boxes and place curbside on your regular compost collection day.

Place your recycling boxes in a convenient location in your home. Sort your recycling into the two boxes, ready for curbside pick-up on your regular compost collection day.

The **Blue box** is for your Paper and Cardboard.

The **Green box** is for your Containers – Plastic, Milk & Metal.

If you need additional recycling boxes they can be purchased at local hardware stores. Don't worry if it isn't a green-coloured box, just make sure you don't mix your containers & your papers together in the same box.

Oops – If you do make a mistake, you may discover an 'Oops' sticker on your box, and material may be left behind. It is important to make sure your containers and papers are separated into different boxes. Please consult the list for unacceptable items.

Fall Cleanup Week

ORGANIC PICK-UP - ALL ITEMS MUST BE AT THE CURBSIDE

Monday, November 16 BY 7:00 a.m. Regardless of your scheduled pick-up day.

This clean-up will be for the collection of leaves and yard waste for composting. Leaves, grass clipping, and bundled twigs that are no longer than 4ft. in length and less than 50lbs. should be placed curbside. Residents are required to use clear compostable bags, non-waxed cardboard cartons or garbage cans that can be emptied into the trucks. Bundles should be no more than four(4) feet long, less than 50lbs. and must be only organic material. No trees larger than 4 inches in diameter. Construction material, such as plywood, will not be picked up.

Residents are encouraged to compost these materials on their own property for use in landscaping and gardening but if this is not appropriate or desirable, the annual pickup provides an environmentally sound means of disposal.

PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR COMPOST CART FOR THIS PICK-UP.

The theme this year is Christmas Winter Wonderland.



A Message from Mayor Bill Bishop

Rothesay is a quiet suburban community that has something to offer children and adults of all ages. We pride ourselves on being a community that is a great place to live and raise a family. To this end, I congratulate Town staff and the many citizens that invest their time and talents in helping to present Rothesay as a place of beautiful gardens, well-kept lawns, and caring people.

Town Council has been very active this year in:

- making improvements to our potable water system
- correcting flooding situations (Oakville Acres)
- making upgrades to roads
- finishing several recreation projects (sports field and trails in Wells)
- completing a major upgrade to the Rothesay Common

With funding from the Federal and Provincial governments and the Town, planning is currently underway to bring "state of the art" waste water treatment improvements to Rothesay. In the long term, this major project will see the closing of the sewer lagoons in Kennebecasis Park and Sagamore Point.

Council has taken a leadership role in the implementation of a curbside recycling service. This service enhances our respect for the environment and helps to reduce the amount of our tax dollars going to the Crane Mountain landfill – it was the right thing to do.

The Finance Committee will be starting the budget process in the immediate future. There are always many calls on Town money and, in making its decisions, Council will continue to respect the fact that Rothesay has one of the lowest tax rates in New Brunswick.

Halloween is fast approaching. Here are some basic Halloween safety tips so everyone has a fun and safe Halloween



- Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.
- Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
- Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses.
- Don't stop at dark houses. Never accept rides from strangers.
