Mayor Bishop called the Public Hearing to order at 7:10 p.m. and gave instructions to those in attendance. He noted the hearings had been duly advertised and the Planning Advisory Committee had given its recommendations.

**MOVED** by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Shea the Public Hearings for By-laws 1-10-01 and 2-02-38 be held concurrently.

CARRIED.

DDS Drescher gave a brief presentation, outlining the proposal and legislative process. She noted the issues raised during the comment period following the Public Presentation focused on density, neighbourhood, stormwater management and traffic. DDS Drescher noted the following: the proposal had been amended from 24 units to 22 units, the current designation would allow 3 units/acre and the proposed designation would allow 4.4 units/acre, the proposed single storey two unit buildings would be approximately the same size as an R1A dwelling, proposal is for high quality building stock with innovative site design and compatible landscaping, lots will be fully serviced, stormwater management will enhance the existing wet area and drain to a functioning wetland and based on an evaluation of the 150-160 additional vehicle movements there will be minimal traffic cut-through potential.

DDS Drescher noted, upon questioning, the enhanced wetland is in the park area, and the closest R3 Zones are the townhouses on the Common, Chapel Hill and Bel-Air Avenue. She further noted the project supports the principles of sustainable development in the Municipal Plan and this project was not anticipated at the time of the Plan's adoption.

Pat Shea and Ted Harley gave a presentation to Council and outlined the following: there are opportunities in Rothesay for infill development, developers have been transparent with the project including polling neighbours, proposal creates transition from Institutional to R1 Zone, units downsized to duplexes of approximately 1600 square feet each with a double car garage, costs too high to develop as single-family residential properties, options to address stormwater management and existing issues in the area and the project meets requests from older clients (empty-nesters) looking to downsize but remain in the community,

Questions were raised by Council with respect to development costs, buffer areas, topography and stormwater management. The developers advised the following: costs would be substantially more for eight single family homes as opposed to the proposed 22 units, proposed project has a value of \$8-10 million, minimum buffer is 10 metres at Arthur Avenue and the buildings could be moved closer to the front property line to gain additional buffer space, difficulty in developing the site is more with respect to associated costs rather than topography

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and construction would likely occur over a three to four year period. The following points were made with respect to stormwater management: current pipe at Arthur Avenue drains onto the property, the pipe off Robertson Drive follows along the two property lines down to Highland Avenue, existing ditching can be improved and piped and details will be prepared by experts.

Mayor Bishop called three times for those who wished to speak in opposition to the proposal. The following people spoke: Stephen Maltby, 16 Arthur Avenue; George Teed, 69 Highland Avenue and Linda Costello, 92 Highland Avenue. The following comments were made: support for the Municipal Plan as it exists, existing Plan and Zoning By-law serve to ensure sustainable development and not economic feasibility vs. moderate density housing, will negatively impact existing character of the neighbourhood, protection of existing neighbourhoods is key tenet of Municipal Plan, environment concerns with respect to the wetland area, the need for an integrated water management plan, need for consultation with Department of Environment representatives and the possible impact on property value of surrounding properties.

DDS Drescher noted the developers are proposing to enhance the wetland area and an Environmental Impact Assessment is required for an area of 2 Ha or greater and this property is .49 Ha. She further noted a watercourse alteration permit and wetland permit will be required and the developers will have experts to work with the Department of Environment.

Mayor Bishop called three times for those who wished to speak in favour of the proposal. The following people spoke: Bill Artiss, 1 McMackin Land and Tony Bamford, 12 Crestwood Drive. The following comments were made: good project, review of track record of developers shows quality work, this type of housing is growing in demand, not economically feasible to develop as single family homes, agree with project with density shown, construction in different styles and all connected to Town utilities and a stormwater management plan put in place, currently the land is being used as a hang-out by teenagers, the neighbourhood has seen many changes over 40 years and this project is a good change that provides options for retirees to stay in the neighbourhood.

Pat Shea and Ted Harley, upon questioning, noted there will be sidewalks along Robertson Drive and Clermont Lane, stormwater management will be addressed as part of the developer's agreement and they are unable to proceed if the Town is not interested in the project.

**MOVED** by Counc. Young and seconded by Counc. Kilfoil the Public Hearings be adjourned.

Mayor Bishop further suggested a meeting be held with residents to discuss the matter and a request be made to the low tenderer to hold his tender price. DO Hatcher advised the Town has been successful with similar requests to bidders in the past.

#### ON THE QUESTION:

Town Manager Jarvie advised the Town would contract for the service collection, based on the concept that at least as much would be collected as is currently being put in the blue bins. Any collection above that would save \$108/tonne. The following points were raised: there is a need for more information, the Town would be required to let a tender and may have to absorb further costs at the end of the proposed six month trial, current guarantee of zero cost if deposited at the blue bins now so why not if it is delivered by a hauler to the Commission, possible funding options and coverage of costs if there is contamination. Town Manager Jarvie advised an application to the Environmental Trust Fund (ETF) had been denied by the province.
