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further noted he understood the insurance company investigators had determined the cause but was unsure if that information had been shared with the Fire Department. Counc. Kilfoil advised the Fire Board had received the same information as Council. Counc. Gallagher Jette suggested if it was an electrical issue there is no guarantee it will not happen again.

ON THE QUESTION:

Counc. Cochrane noted the LPP being taken is for both Phases 2 and 3 of the development.

➤ Rothesay Estates Subdivision Phase 3 (Paige Street)

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Shea Council assent to the tentative subdivision plan, (Dwg. No. T-0319) dated February 2, 2009 for the Phase 3 development of Rothesay Estates subdivision to create a public road to be known as Paige Street.

CARRIED.

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Kilfoil Council authorize the Mayor and Clerk to enter into the Development Agreement for the development of the property off Isaac Street, identified as a portion of PID# 00243683.

CARRIED.

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Kilfoil Council accept land for public purposes (LPP) for the Rothesay Estates Subdivision, as noted on the tentative subdivision plan, (Dwg. No. T-0319) dated February 2, 2009 for Phase 3 development.

ON THE QUESTION:

Counc. Cochrane noted the LPP being taken in this phase will connect to the walking path taken as LPP in Phase 2.

➤ Kirkpatrick Road Subdivision

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Kilfoil Council assent to the extension of Kirkpatrick Road, subject to a Development Agreement, to allow for the development of a 4 lot subdivision involving the properties identified as PID#s 00243287 and 00441188.

CARRIED.

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Shea Council authorize the Mayor and Clerk to enter into the Development Agreement for the development of Kirkpatrick Road in association with a subdivision involving the properties identified as PID#s 00243287 and 00441188; subject to an amendment to the agreement that allows for above ground services.

ON THE QUESTION:

Counc. Cochrane advised the existing services along Kirkpatrick Road and Dobson Lane are above ground and the developer is investigating the possibility of bringing power along the back edge of two of the properties from Dobson Lane. He further noted the Committee had determined this to be a case of extenuating circumstances. DDS Drescher advised the Subdivision By-law requires all new development to provide underground services and any change must be granted by Council.

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MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Deputy Mayor MacDonald Council accept \$2250.00 as cash in lieu of land for public purposes for the subdivision involving the properties identified as PID#s 00243287 and 00441188.

ON THE QUESTION:

Deputy Mayor MacDonald requested clarification on the amount of \$750 per lot. DDS Drescher advised the matter had been brought forward to Council at a previous working session and is under review.

ON THE QUESTION:

DO Hatcher advised the Wharf renovation project will proceed once the required permit is received from the Department of Environment. He advised it would likely be completed in the third or fourth week of August. Deputy Mayor MacDonald requested additional information with respect to the roped-off swimming area adjacent to the wharf and expressed concern about possible debris alongside the wharf. Mayor Bishop requested DO Hatcher undertake an immediate review.

MOVED by Counc. Cochrane and seconded by Counc. Young Council award the subject quotation to the low bidder, Atlantic Windoor Ltd. for the quotation prices of \$8,814.00, inclusive of HST.

DO Hatcher advised a garage door will be replaced at the Master Drive works garage and the old door will be installed at the upper works garage. It was noted \$2500 modification is included in the budget and no motion is required.

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9. **NEW BUSINESS**

9.1 Proposed Municipal Plan By-law 1-09

7 July 2009 Memorandum from DDS Drescher (Comments received)

The memorandum, comments and recommendations were received for information. The comments were categorized in four groups: Hillside Development, Millennium Park, General, and Specific Land Related comments. Counc. Gallagher Jette noted she was not prepared to support higher density for the Hillside Development area. Deputy Mayor MacDonald requested clarification with respect to what has changed and what has remained the same. DDS Drescher noted staff made recommendations to Council and the Planning Advisory Committee, the Public Presentation was held and the comments received have been reviewed. DDS Drescher advised the memorandum reiterated that staff recommendations be adopted. Counc. Mullett noted that issues with traffic, green space and density in the Hillside Development area will be addressed through sustainable community principles. Counc. Gallagher Jette noted she had several questions about what sustainability meant and implied as it appeared to have a broad interpretation. DDS Drescher advised Chapter 2 of the proposed Municipal Plan outlines a number of principles related to sustainability. She advised staff is trying to convey to the public through the Plan Council recognizes the need to address development, traffic issues, water concerns and green spaces. She stated if Rothesay follows the principles as presented, it will be a stand-alone community that will not need to rely heavily on other communities. It will be a viable, functioning and content community. Counc. Gallagher Jette suggested this was the practice in the former community of Renforth. DDS Drescher suggested Council has taken due diligence, reviewed the Plan in the five year required time frame and taken it to the public twice so perhaps no changes are required.

Counc. Cochrane noted the Hillside area could be developed now with single family He further noted that having a secondary planning area will afford the opportunity to identify sensitive areas and protect them during development. Higher density is a sustainable practice and it appeals to both the developer and the Town. Town Manager Jarvie noted a sustainability plan will be required for the Town to access federal funding. He further noted Council has recognized developers are bringing forward proposals for higher density projects, as noted by the two developments approved this evening, and further noted higher density, noise, traffic and water are sensitive issues. Counc. Shea questioned why individual recommendations were being brought forward now when Council will vote on the entire Plan. Mayor Bishop indicates staff is seeking advice as to what is acceptable to Council and to the public. Town Manager Jarvie noted the Zoning By-law will be brought forward with the Municipal Plan and further detail will be available in the Zoning By-law, thereby suggesting there may not be a need to vote at present. Mayor Bishop noted the properties included in the Hillside Development area are privately owned. There was a brief discussion with respect to the sensitivity surrounding higher density and Council was advised the details would be outlined in the Zoning By-law.

Counc. Shea declared a conflict of interest and left the meeting room at 9:25 p.m.

Counc. Kilfoil raised concerns with respect to adopting LEED standards for development and that it may dissuade developers from a cost perspective. He further noted he was not opposed to higher density in the Hillside area. DDS Drescher noted staff is recommending LEED standards be monitored, not necessarily implemented, to determine if any opportunities may exist for development in Rothesay. Counc. Young indicated he

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had no objection to LEED standards.

Counc. Shea returned to the meeting room.

DDS Drescher noted Chapter 2 of the Municipal Plan outlines sustainable principles to be adopted, noting a monitoring program would have to be developed. Counc. Cochrane suggested LEED standards be considered for the entire community, not just in the Millennium Park area. DDS Drescher noted there are standards for building conversions but adoption across the community is not possible, particularly with the concerns expressed by council members. Mayor Bishop asked if stormwater management was included in the plan for the Hillside development area. DDS Drescher noted that stormwater management is one of the key sustainable community principles.

9.2 Master Recreation Plan

9 July 2009 Memorandum from Town Clerk Banks

The memorandum and correspondence were received for information. Town Manager Jarvie advised the final report is to be received by the end of August but the consultants are seeking Council comments to complete it as soon as possible. Mayor Bishop noted the recommendations were: a fieldhouse, more trails, and another arena, in that order. Deputy Mayor MacDonald noted the report had flushed out shortages in recreation services and he expected further recommendations on how to deal with those, mentioning youth centres and seniors groups. He further indicated the report focused more on surveying groups rather than individuals. Counc. Cochrane noted individuals had the opportunity to participate at the Open House. Deputy Mayor MacDonald advised his intent was to have an objective, independent study done to determine the needs of the community, not just presenting groups. Mayor Bishop advised the consultants were retained instead of Council or the Recreation Committee completing the study and the consultants are from Fredericton and did a fair job getting views from across all users. Counc. Young noted the content of the report was fine but was disappointed with the presentation, as was Counc. Gallagher Jette. Counc. Gallagher Jette advised she had hoped for best practices from across the country and noted the report emphasized the need for trails and a sensitivity toward the needs of seniors. Mayor Bishop requested Council provide any comments sooner rather than later so they could be forwarded to the consultants. Counc. Cochrane advised he thought the report was more of an inventory with no recommendations. He commented that basically a list had been provided and Council has to decide which options to pursue.

ON THE QUESTION:

DDS Drescher advised the landscaping had been completed with the exception of one flower bed which will be planted by the children's parents. Counc. Shea requested clarification on the onsite septic system. There was a brief discussion and it was noted the building is significantly lower than the street level and therefore cannot connect to the gravity system. Counc. Cochrane asked if a connection could be made to Cove Crescent. Mayor Bishop requested DO Hatcher review the matter and report back to Council.
