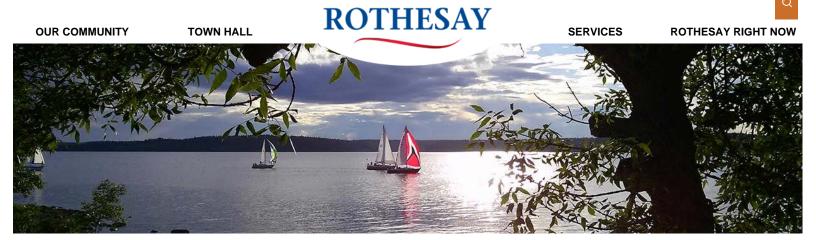

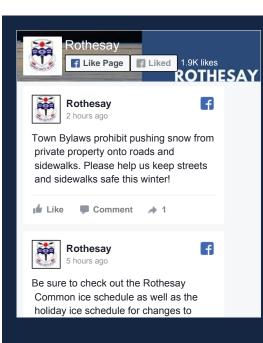

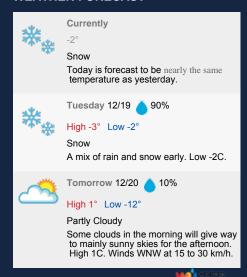

Il est l'opinion de beaucoup d'adultes que les jeunes d'aujourd'hui ont un grand manque d'intérêt dans les nouvelles et dans la politique. Bien que l'on peut voir ceci dans la majorité des cas, il y existe des exceptions importantes à ce stéréotype. Depuis un jeune âge, j'ai eu beaucoup d'intérêts pour l'actualité ainsi que divers sujets politiques. J'ai surtout été intéressé d'approfondir mes connaissances liées au fonctionnement du gouvernement. Tellement, qu'on m'a introduit à un programme pour Jeunes centré sur la politique. Le « Forum pour jeunes Canadiens » est un programme où les jeunes ont une excellente occasion d'en apprendre beaucoup à ce sujet. Cette année, j'ai eu le grand honneur d'être sélectionné pour y participer. Ce Forum se passe au parlement d'Ottawa pendant la semaine du dimanche 28 janvier au 3 février. Les frais d'inscription sont de 795 \$ et j'aurai besoin d'une aide financière de la part de ma communauté.

Pour commencer, je crois qu'il serait juste que je vous partage un peu d'information sur mon intérêt dans la politique. Mon intérêt m'est venu à un jeune âge lorsque je débattais mon point de vue avec mes parents afin qu'ils me laissent jouer à des jeux vidéo contenant de la violence. J'ai gagné ce débat, mais peu après, lors de l'élection fédérale de 2015, mon enseignant de géographie, m'a fait écouter l'élection, en classe, ce qui m'a initié à plusieurs sujets de débats politiques. Par la suite, j'ai participé à un camp d'été organisé par la Fédération des travailleurs et des travailleuses du Nouveau-Brunswick qui m'a beaucoup plus instruit sur les enjeux qui concernent les syndicats et je me suis joint au comité de la voix des jeunes où à l'aide d'une douzaine de jeunes d'à travers la province, je travaille à aider le bureau de défense de la jeunesse en lui donnant mes opinions sur certaines des propositions qu'ils suggèrent pour améliorer la situation des enfants du Nouveau-Brunswick. Tout ceci est pour appuyer que mon intérêt dans la politique n'est pas nouveau, mais très développé. Ceci est pourquoi je crois que ce programme serait idéal pour moi et qu'il serait un très bon investissement afin de m'aider à financer mes frais de participation.

De plus, si je participe à ce programme, je pourrais enrichir davantage le niveau de connaissances sur le gouvernement et la politique de n'importe quel individu de la communauté. De plus, j'ai de la facilité à expliquer des concepts parfois complexes aux gens que je rencontre. Par exemple, je fais du tutorat, bénévolement, pour Gui Verna et j'ai souvent

été bien complimenté pour être très bon à expliquer ou même enseigner des concepts aux jeunes que j'aide. Mais j'ai bien plus que de l'expérience en bénévolat pour démontrer mes talents. En salle de classe, mes camarades de classe m'ont souvent dit qu'ils adoraient mes présentations orales puisqu'elles leur enseignaient beaucoup de choses à propos du sujet que je présentais. Donc, mon talent à expliquer et à enseigner les gens que je rencontre est également une très grande démonstration de mon potentiel à contribuer à la communauté en participant à ce programme. Puisque l'on entend beaucoup parler du stéréotype mentionné plus tôt, cet enrichissement serait une très bonne contribution à la communauté dont vous pourriez contribuer à amener à notre communauté.

Pour conclure, je crois, sincèrement qu'il serait un grand investissement, de m'aider à participer à ce programme puisqu'avec mon intérêt dans la politique j'absorberai certainement beaucoup d'information et qu'avec mes compétences en enseignement, je pourrai très bien la transmettre à n'importe qui que je rencontrerai dans la communauté. Alors s'il vous plait, aidez-moi à enrichir notre communauté!

Members of Council,

It is the opinion of many adults that young people today have a big lack of interest in news and politics. Although we can see this in the majority of cases, there are important exceptions to this stereotype. Since a young age, I had a lot of interest for the news as well as various political subjects. I have been mostly interested in deepening my knowledge of how the government works. So much that I was introduced to a program for young people centered on politics. The Forum for Young Canadians is a program where youth have an excellent opportunity to learn a lot on this subject. This year, I had the great honor of being selected to participate. This forum is held in Ottawa on Parliament Hill during the week of Sunday, January 28, 2018 to Saturday, February 3, 2018. The registration fee is \$795 and I will need financial help from my community.

To start, I think it would be fair for me to share some information on my interest in politics. My interest came to me at a young age when I was debating my point of view with my parents so that they let me play video games containing violence, I won this debate, but soon after, at the 2015 federal election, my geography teacher, the election, in class, which made me interested in several topics of political debate. Afterwards, I participated in a summer camp organized by the New Brunswick Federation of Labor, which increased my education on union issues and created the Young Workers Committee. With help from a dozen young people from across the province, I worked at Help the Youth Advocacy Office by giving my opinions on some of the proposals they suggested to improve the situation of New Brunswick children. All this is to support that my interest in politics is not new, but highly developed. That is why I think this program would be ideal for me and it would be a very good investment to help me finance my participation fees.

Moreover, if I participate in this program, I could further enrich the level of knowledge about the government and politics of any individual in the community. In addition, I have the ability to explain sometimes complex concepts to people that I meet. For example, I do tutoring, voluntarily, for Gui Verna and I often have been well praised for being very good at explaining or even teaching concepts to young people. I have more than volunteer experience to demonstrate my talents. In the classroom, my classmates often told me that they loved my oral presentations since they taught them many things about the subject I was presenting. So, my talent of explaining and teaching is also a great demonstration of my potential contribute to the community through participation in this program. Since we hear a lot about the mentioned stereotype earlier, this enrichment would be a very good contribution to the community of which you could contribute to lead to our community.

To conclude, I believe, sincerely that it would be a great investment, to help me participate in this program since with my interest in politics I will certainly absorb a lot of information and with my teaching skills, I could very well teach anyone I meet in the community. So please, help me enrich our community. If you want to help me participate in this program, but you do not have the money to cover the amount of \$795, I would accept a lower amount, depending on your means.

RE: \*URGENT ATTENTION\* - Transfer Station Application - Green For Life Environmental Inc.

Dear Minister Rousselle.

The Fundy Regional Service Commission (FRSC) has recently received verbal confirmation that Green for Life Environmental Inc. (GFL) has applied to construct a transfer station in Saint John, NB for the purposes of shipping garbage to a GFL landfill in Nova Scotia. This information did not reach us through any official channel and requests for information to different parties have been denied or not answered. As such, we do not have a timeline on the approval process and we are requesting your urgent attention. GFL is proposing a low-cost option to customers by shipping garbage and avoiding the imposed and implied obligations the FRSC has to operate under. This approval will either result in increased costs to New Brunswick taxpayers or the loss of programs and the associated jobs. Frankly, we are shocked that this application is being considered and FRSC is asking that this application be immediately denied.

Our landfill at Crane Mountain in Saint John was constructed as a solid waste management solution for the region in the 1990's. The communities have committed to the infrastructure and programs over the past 20 years with the understanding that waste in the region would continue to fund the programs. Considering the current Regional Service Delivery Act (and the previous Clean Environment Act), financially binds the municipalities and local service districts to any solid waste liabilities, this is not an unreasonable expectation.

Currently, GFL represents 10% of garbage revenue and that deficit would be transferred to the communities. The main, and larger competitor, Fero, also has a landfill in Nova Scotia and will respond to any action from a competitor to grow business, resulting in further revenue loss to FRSC. As the private sector represents two-thirds of our volume, the financial burden on taxpayers would be quite severe.

FRSC cannot compete with a private business that does not carry the same obligations. If this transfer station is built, FSRC will be left with no alternative but to level the playing field immediately. Initially, this will result in the loss of ten (10) full-time positions and seven (7) casual positions, all associated with the elimination of diversion programs to which GFL has no obligation. Unfortunately, we will be the precedent for expansion to other regions.

I would appreciate the opportunity to discuss this further, or, if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. Again, we are asking for your support in that this application be immediately denied. Please keep us informed as to your decision.
