Although spring flooding is a distant memory for many, those living in the flood zone will remain vigilant and take measures to mitigate damage. At present there is no specific government funding for flood mitigation measures and the Town will be carrying out some work to reduce vulnerability. Sections of Cameron Road and Rothesay Park Road are being raised to aid in access during high water and other locations are being analyzed. While we are all hopeful the 2020 freshet will see lower river levels, the Town will continue to work to provide service during flood conditions, make improvements to access points and protect public assets. Individual property owners in the flood zone are encouraged to take steps to protect their private properties. Keep in mind permits are required for most types of construction. # **Fall Cleanup Week**

ORGANIC PICK-UP - ALL ITEMS MUST BE AT THE CURBSIDE

Monday, November 11th BY 7:00 a.m. regardless of your scheduled pick-up day

This clean-up will be for the collection of leaves and yard waste for composting. Leaves, grass clippings, and bundled twigs **TIED IN MANAGEABLE BUNDLES**, no longer than 4ft. in length and less than 50lbs. should be placed curbside. Residents are to use clear compostable bags, paper yard waste bags, non-waxed cardboard cartons or garbage cans that can be emptied into the trucks. No trees larger than 4 inches in diameter. **Construction material, such as plywood, will not be picked up.** 

Residents are encouraged to compost these materials on their own property for use in landscaping and gardening but if this is not appropriate or desirable, the annual pickup provides an environmentally sound means of disposal.

#### PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR COMPOST CART FOR THIS PICK-UP

We have reached the end of a summer perfect for activities: we enjoyed wonderful attendance at the Canada Day celebration and the Concerts on the Common. It was also nice to see the increased participation in this year's Playground Program - the added lunch program was well received! Beaches were also well-utilized, as well as the river in general.

The summer began with Rothesay being officially recognized by the Province as an Age Friendly Community, and the Official Opening of the Rothesay HIVE Age Friendly Community Centre. Interest in the HIVE grew over the summer and it now is a place bustling with programs, people and activities. We invite all folks age 50 and over to visit the HIVE, located in Town Hall, and check out the offerings. Hours of operation are Monday & Thursday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, Tuesday & Wednesday II am to 7:30 pm and Friday 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. Of course, being summer, construction was in evidence at several sites. We thank residents for their patience as several necessary projects were undertaken: new sidewalk on Marr Road, new water main and resurfacing on Hampton Road, surfacing of Allan Avenue and other streets throughout the community, and the major drainage project on Church Avenue/ Station Road. Additionally, flood mitigation efforts were carried out on Cameron Road and Rothesay Park Road.

Parks and Recreation had a busy summer with the replacement of the turf on the lower field at Arthur Miller Field and the official opening on New Brunswick Day of the East Riverside-Kingshurst Park. Residents enjoyed picnics at the Park on that day and, at the request of a number of residents, picnic tables have been added to the pavilion in the Park, and are well utilized. We welcomed the Saint John Astronomy Club to the Park on September 13th, a perfect night for stargazing.

As we come into Fall, please drive slowly, especially in school zones, and be mindful of children playing. Also, we all enjoy our dogs - but please pick up after your pets.
