The Province of New Brunswick remains under a Renewed and Revised Mandatory Order (16 April 2020) and State of Emergency (19 March 2020) PNB State of Emergency/Mandatory Order.

Municipal Parks remain open – PLEASE RESPECT social distancing - 2 metres (6 feet). If we do not have cooperation on this, we will be required to close the parks to everyone.

Essential services will continue including water and sewer services, garbage collection and road maintenance. **Development services** and building inspection will continue and contact can be made by phone or email Rothesay.ca or 848-6600. All calls and requests are being responded to on a priority basis.
