
A) Here are 13 discussion questions to help kick-off discussion. Members can take turns reading the question aloud.

- **1.** Long-held secrets play a central role in the plot. Do you think important secrets can ever be kept without causing some kind of damage?
- 2. Do you think Maura and Mickey Brennan's experience of the Troubles in Ireland led to their habit of secret-keeping? What caused the Brennans to be a family of secret-keepers?
- 3. Is your family dynamic similar to the Brennans'? In what ways is it different?
- **4.** What is the significance of West Manor as the story's setting? How does it differ from the other cities mentioned, like Katonah or Los Angeles?
- 5. Why do you think the author chose to tell each chapter from a different character's point of view? Do you think it was effective?
- 6. Which member of the Brennan clan do you relate to the most?
- 7. What do you think are the most important themes of the book?
- 8. How did learning about the history between the Brennans and the Walshes change your view of Billy?



- 9. What roles do mothers play in this book?
- **10.** Do you think Sunday's coming back into Kale's life was ultimately a good thing for Kale? For Sunday?
- 11. What do you think about Kale's relationship with Vivienne?
- 12. Did you expect the ending to unfold the way it did?
- 13. What do you think will happen next for these characters?



Abstract: Molly Dunn is not like everyone else. She struggles with social skills and interprets people literally. A smile means you're happy. "Thank you" means you're grateful. Her Gran used to

interpret the world for her, codifying it into simple rules that Molly could live by. Since Gran died a few months ago, twenty-five-year-old Molly has had to navigate life's complexities all by herself. No matter--she throws herself with gusto into her work as a hotel maid. Her unique character, along with her obsessive love of cleaning and proper etiquette, make her an ideal fit for the job. She delights in donning her crisply pressed uniform each morning, stocking her trolley with hygienically wrapped soaps and miniature shampoo bottles, and returning guest rooms at the Regency Grand Hotel to a state of perfection. But Molly's orderly life is turned upside down when she enters the penthouse suite of Charles Black, an infamous wealthy guest, only to find it in a state of disarray and Mr. Black himself very dead in his bed.

Abstract: Every catastrophe begins with a little problem that doesn't get fixed." So says Pauline Green, president of the United States, in Ken Follett's nerve-racking drams of international tension.

A shrinking oasis in the Sahara Desert; a stolen US Army drone; an uninhabited Japanese island; and one country's secret stash of deadly chemical poisons: all these play roles in a relentlessly escalating crisis. Struggling to prevent the outbreak of world war are a young woman intelligence officer; a spy working undercover with jihadists; a brilliant Chinese spymaster; and Pauline herself, beleaguered by a populist rival for the next presidential election. "Never" is an extraordinary novel, full of heroines and villains, false prophets and elite warriors, jaded politicians and opportunistic revolutionaries. It brims with cautionary wisdom for our times and delivers a visceral, heart-pounding read that transports readers to the brink of the unimaginable.


Title: Something to Hide Author: Elizabeth George

Abstract: Edwin St. Andrew is eighteen years old when he crosses the Atlantic by steamship, exiled from polite society following an ill-

conceived diatribe at a dinner party. He enters the forest,

spellbound by the beauty of the Canadian wilderness, and suddenly hears the notes of a violin echoing in an airship terminal--an experience that shocks him to his core. Two centuries later a famous writer named Olive Llewellyn is on a book tour. She's traveling all over Earth, but her home is the second moon colony, a place of white stone, spired towers, and artificial beauty. Within the text of Olive's bestselling pandemic novel lies a strange passage: a man plays his violin for change in the echoing corridor of an airship terminal as the trees of a forest rise around him. When Gaspery-Jacques Roberts, a detective in the black-skied Night City, is hired to investigate an anomaly in the North American wilderness, he uncovers a series of lives upended: The exiled son of an earl driven to madness, a writer trapped far from home as a pandemic ravages Earth, and a childhood friend from the Night City who, like Gaspery himself, has glimpsed the chance to do something extraordinary that will disrupt the timeline of the universe.
